Roberto Curci is an Associate Professor of Finance and the Eugene Ratliff Endowed Chair of Finance at Butler University's College of Business. He holds a Ph.D. in International Business and Finance from University of Texas Pan American, a Master of Business Administration (MBA) with concentrations in International Business and Finance from University of Miami (Florida), a Bachelor of Business Administration from ICESI University (Cali, Colombia), and a Bachelor of Science in Systems Engineering from ICESI University (Cali, Colombia).

Professor Curci's regularly teaches in the fields of international finance and international business. He is regularly invited to teach executive seminars and graduate level courses in leading Schools of Business in the United States, Europe, Asia, and Latin America. His academic research focuses on International Financial Markets and Institutions, Foreign Exchange Risk Management, the Internationalization Processes of the Firm, and Immigrant-Owned Businesses. His researcher has been published in books and has also appeared in academic journals such as *Thunderbird International Business Review*, *International Finance Review*, *Journal of Emerging Markets*, *Studies in Economics and Finance*, *Latin American Business Review*, *Journal of Accounting and Finance Research*, and the *Global Business & Finance Review*.
